

Unit Movement Officer Deployment Planners Course (UMO 151)

Reporting Instructions

Unit Movement Officers Deployment Planners Course (UMODP) provides unit deployment officers and NCOs at company, troop or battery level with the ability to plan, organize, and conduct company-size unit movements, training, and operations. Instruction consists of conference (lecture), hands-on training utilizing instructor-led and independent student practical exercises, and demonstration type training. Topics include: development of unit movement plans; TC-AIMS II (computer training) creating OEL,UDL; preparing unit supplies, equipment, and personnel; using containers in unit-movement planning; weighing and marking equipment for Air Movement; rail-equipment characteristics & rail load out exercises; blocking, bracing, packing, crating, and tie down procedures for equipment of all modes. Loading 463L pallets.

Reporting

The IMS attending the Unit Movement Officers Deployment Planners Course (UMODP) will report to the Kristall Inn on Rose Barracks located in Vilseck, Germany, one (1) day prior to the start of training. Dinner meal will be available at the Dragoon Inn Dining Facility (Bldg 603, Rose Barracks) for those arriving prior to 1800 hrs. Arrival after 1800hrs, Dining Facility will be closed and meals will not be available. IMS will then be responsible to provide their own meals.

Individual items required

Soldiers will need to bring the items listed below:

- Uniform, duty
- Undergarments
- Headgear (as prescribed by their respective country)
- Helmet
- Gloves, work
- Eye protection
- Inclement weather clothing (i.e. wet weather, cold weather, etc.)
- Personal hygiene items
- Writing instruments/paper for note taking
- Other items they deem they need to bring.

Day One of course Start Date

Students will report to Building 336, Combined Arms Training Center (CATC) HQ, Rose Barracks, Vilseck **at 0700hrs** to start in-processing. Please have Your Passport and a copy of ITO available. **Classrooms are located within walking distance. Therefore, transportation is not a requirement for this course. However, due to the length of the course, transportation is strongly recommended.**

Transportation

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Students must arrange transportation to and from home station – they will not be picked up at an airport or from any other location. The village of Sorghof, Germany, can be used as a reference point to "Google" direction to Rose Barracks. Sorghof is right outside the main gate.

If flying, Nuremberg (Nürnberg) is much closer to Vilseck than Munich (München), so Nuremberg is the preferred destination for flying to Germany (airport code: NUE). Nürnberg is also preferable as it is a small, uncomplicated airport.

Taking a train from the Nürnberg airport is the easiest option to Vilseck. Ticket machines are located directly outside the arrival area with an escalator left of the machines (as you exit the airport) to the trains. Nürnberg subway (S-Bahn) has a station directly at the airport. Take the S-Bahn to Nürnberg main station (Nürnberg Hauptbahnhof abbreviated Hbf). The airport is the end of the line you so cannot get on a train going in the wrong direction (only option is toward the city center). **The approximate cost will be 50 Euros one way/100 Euros round trip**

Upon arrival at Nürnberg Hbf, take the train to Vilseck (it is on the train line to Weiden) but ensure the train is scheduled to stop at Vilseck as some do not. Take a Regional Express (RE) train as ICE trains may not stop there plus the Bayernpass is not valid on the ICE!

Students must hire a taxi to travel to Rose Barracks. If the required information to arrange post access was provided as requested, the taxi will be able to access the installation and take personnel directly to the Kristall Inn. If access information was not provided, the taxi will have to leave Soldiers at the Gate and they will have to walk (approximately 2 Kms).

Note: Return transportation. International military students are actively involved in training on their final day, in order to complete the entire program of instruction, do not schedule return plane flights departing from Nuremberg International Airport before 1800 or Munich International Airport before 1830. If you unable to book a return flight after 1800/1830 on the final day of training and your students must remain on Rose Barracks until the following day, your case will charged for an additional day of life support.
