**7th ARMY TRAINING COMMAND**  
**GRAFENWOEHR, GERMANY**



HOHENFELS, Germany – The U.S. Army, along with NATO Allies and partners, will host Combined Resolve 24-02 from May 13 – Jun 24, 2024 with 7th Army Training Command at Hohenfels Training Area, Germany.

Combined Resolve 24-02 is a recurring exercise designed to prepare a multinational brigade in support of NATO deterrence initiatives. The 3rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 101st Infantry Division from Fort Campbell, KY serves as the primary training audience, with the 2nd Romanian Infantry Division serving as the Division Command.

Approximately 4,000 participants from NATO Allied and partner nations will participate in the exercise. Countries expected to participate in the exercise include, but are not limited to: Albania, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, Italy, Lithuania, North Macedonia, Romania, Slovenia, and the United Kingdom.

Army units participating include, but are not limited to, the 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Liberty, North Carolina; the 3rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team, 101st Infantry Division, Fort Campbell, Kentucky; the 3rd Battalion, 1st Aviation Regiment, 1st Combat Aviation Brigade, 1st Infantry Division, Fort Riley, Kansas; the 1st Battalion, 77th Field Artillery Regiment, Grafenwoehr, Germany; Civil Affairs and Psychological Operations teams, U.S. Army Reserve; and elements of the Maryland, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia National Guards..

Exercise Combined Resolve is a recurring U.S. Army Europe and Africa exercise series held at 7<sup>th</sup> Army Training Command and the Joint Multinational Readiness Center in Bavaria, Germany. Combined Resolve evaluates and assesses a brigade's ability to conduct operations in a complex, multi-domain battlespace. U.S. military forces stationed in Europe routinely conduct these types of exercises with Allied and partner nations to enhance interoperability and readiness.
